

Stark industrial scenes, high contrast abstract patterns and bold graffiti make up the URBN mosaic collection.



Since its founding in 1991, Artists for Humanity (AFH) has used art and design to bridge economic, racial, and social divides by providing creative training, mentorship, and paid employment opportunities to underserved urban youth. AFH grew from what was then an ambitious and unconventional idea – young people can provide, through their innate talent and vision, contemporary creative services to the business community. Today, AFH employs 250+ Boston teens annually in paid apprenticeships in the visual arts and creative industries.








LEXI ZOTOV








MIKEY GUADARRAMA






KELSEY Arbona













